- On 16 July 1846, Alexander Kent was age 26 years (born about 1820) and he stated he was born in Brooklyn, Kings, New York.
- Enlisted on 19 March 1842 for four years and discharged 16 July 1846.
- Alexander Kent signed with his signature.

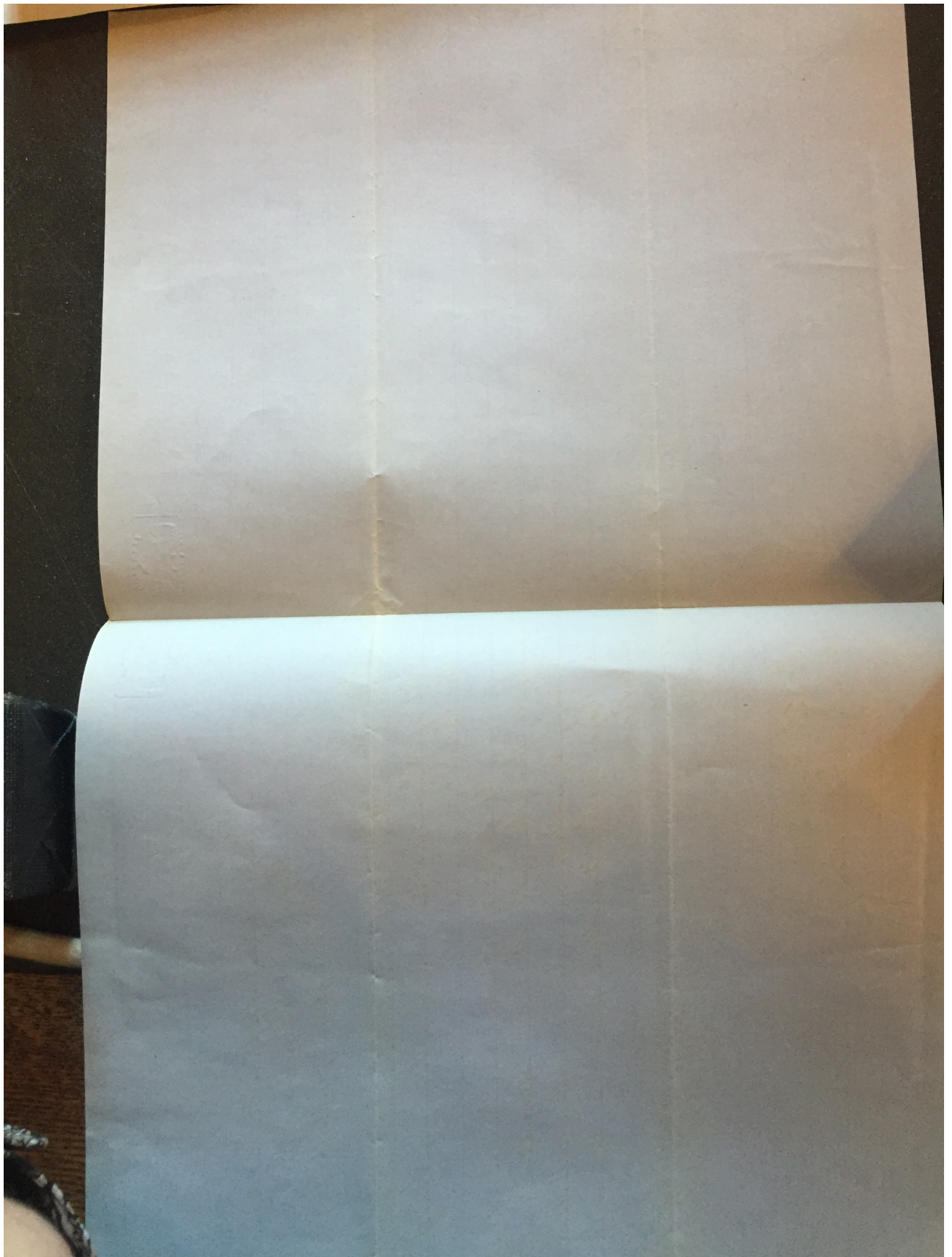

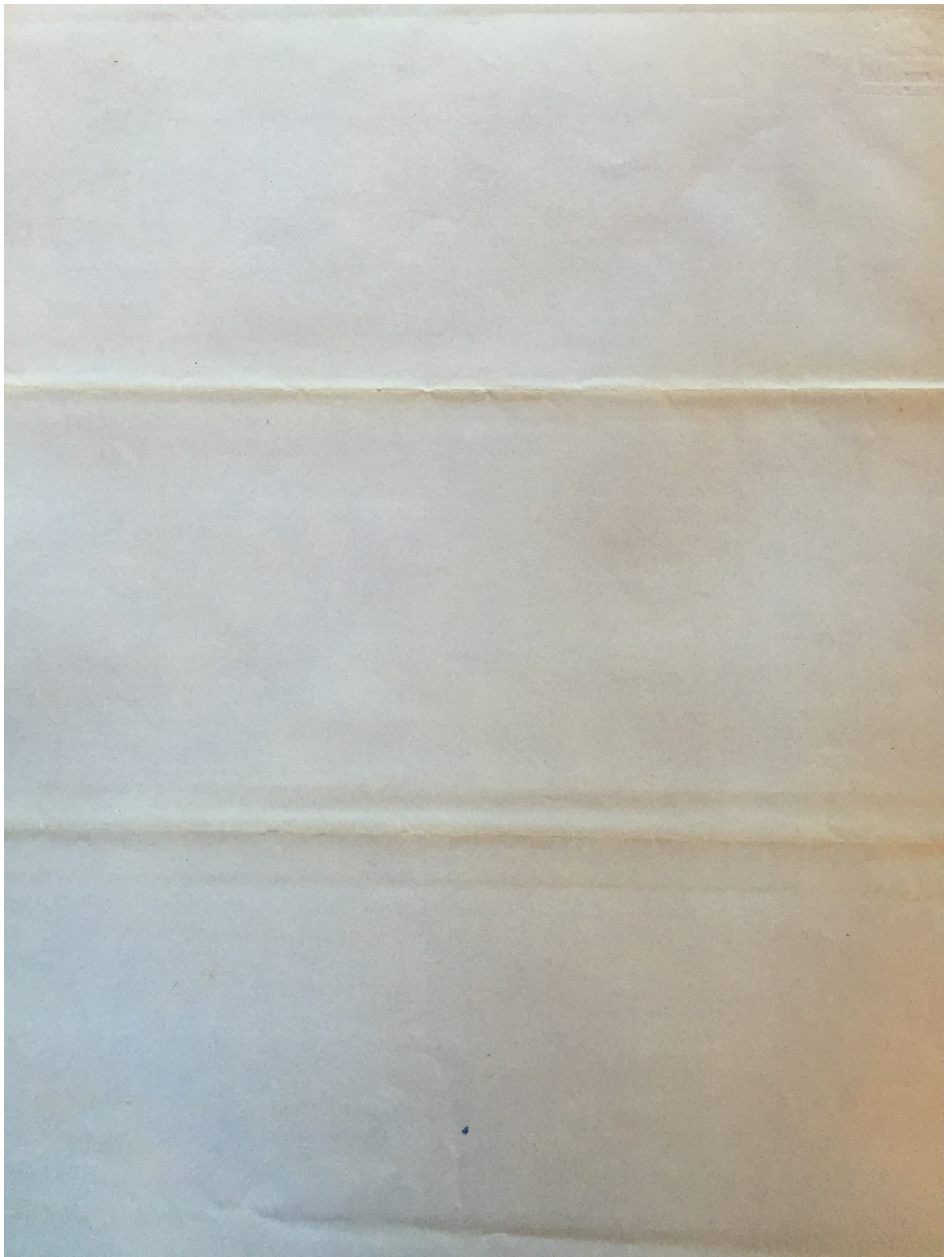

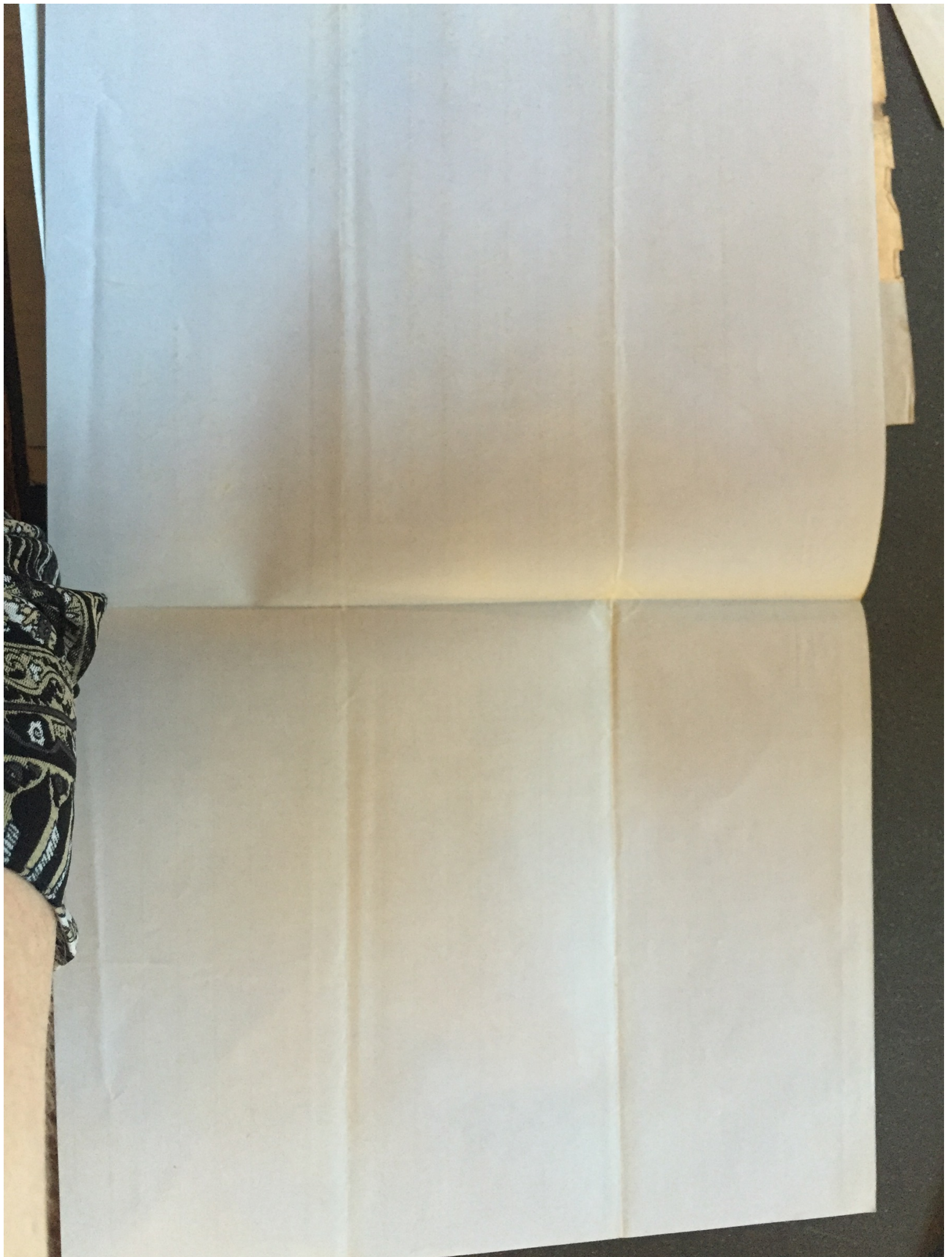
It does not appear from the records of

sworn according to law, deposes
and says that he is the identical
Alexander Kent, who enlisted
at the City of New York on the
sixteenth day of July 1842 for the
term of four years and served
in the United States Corps of
Marines under the Command
of Captain Buchannon in the
United States Vicesines Sloop of
War and served at Vera Cruz
Tampico, and Campeachy &c
and was honorably discharged
at the City of Washington D.C.
on the 16th day of July 1846 -
by reason of expiration of term
of enlistment

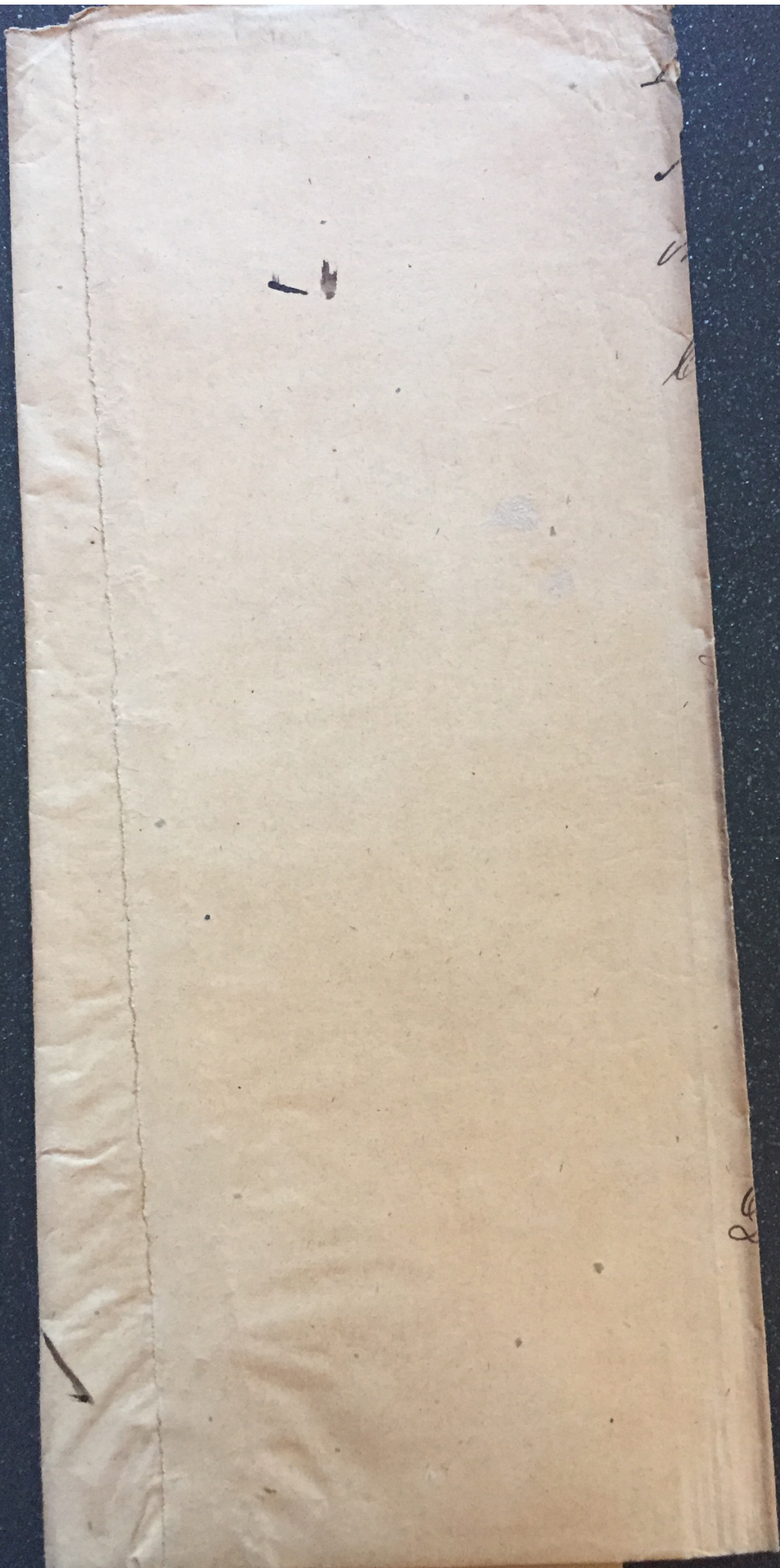
