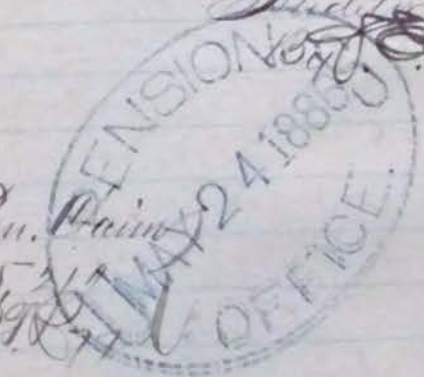

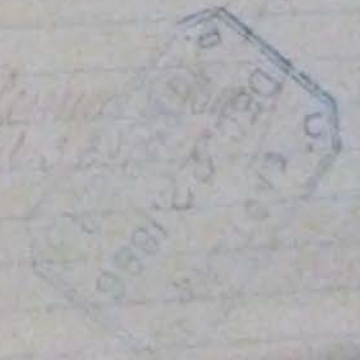

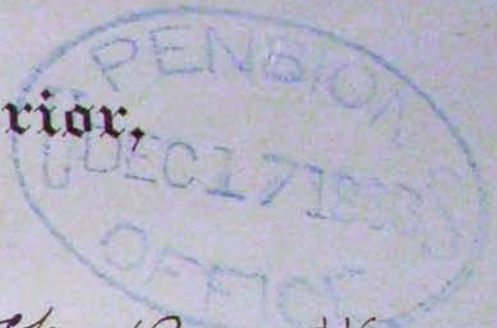

With all claims for arrears, advances, or renewals to the full, the original pension certificate must be returned, or explanation
of its absence or of its return under oath.
To facilitate the adjustment of claims, all the requisite evidence that is available should be forwarded with the application.

who claims a pension as the dependent Father of Alonzo Kent who is alleged to have died June 4-62, and that in my opinion, based on such examination and a personal acquaintance with him for _____ years, the said Peter Kent is and has been physically incapacitated for the support of himself and family, the nature, degree, and duration of his disability being as follows:

Here present a full and explicit statement as to the nature of the disability, and the particular manner and degree in which it has interfered with his procuring a subsistence, from prior to the son's enlistment and death to the present date, giving his occupation and approximate age. If the facts are not within your personal knowledge, please to so state, and give your best judgment as to the probable duration and extent of the disability.

He is 68 years of age and has internal piles from which he says he has suffered for 25 or 30 years. At present the disease is in a mild form, though the thickened and congested condition of the mucous surface of the rectum shows the difficulty to have been of long standing. The condition of the heart and lungs seems to be quite normal, as also are the kidneys though he has difficulty of passing urine, owing to an enlarged prostate. His appetite and digestion are impaired and he is very thin in flesh. He is a stranger to me and I have no history of his previous conditions, but think him unable to support himself by his labor at present and think such has been his condition ever since thus affected with the piles.

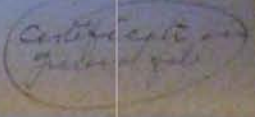

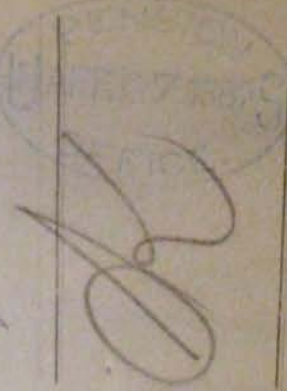

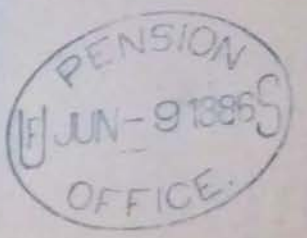
