- On 16 April 1851, Permilly Kent, widow of Asahel Kent, was age 52 and a resident of Brandon, Oakland Co., Michigan.
- Asahel Kent was drafted at Lydon, Lewis, New York. He served as a substitute for William Jenks.
- On 13 April 1855, Parmelia[?] Kent was age 56 and a resident of Brandon, Oakland Co., Michigan.
- Asahel Kent and Parmelia Winshell/Winchell were married 20 September 1821.
- She signed with her signature.
- Asahel died at Waterford, Oakland, Michigan on or about the 26th day of May 1848.
- "Asahel Kent married to Parnelia[?] Winshell on the twentieth day of September 1821. Said Asahel Kent was born April 15th, 1798, Parmelia Winshell his wife was born January 6th 1799." [Signed] Permilly Kent
