
**Notes after a cursory review of file by Michelle M. Roy, June, 2015**: (Please review file and confirm following notes, some of these files have been quickly reviewed in order to make available to the public.)

- On 23 November 1850 Ashford Kent was in Williams Co., Ohio and testified that he witnessed the same Benjamin Kent being honorably discharged and that he had served in the same regiment as Benjamin Kent. Ashford Kent signed with his signature.
- On 23 November 1850 Benjamin Kent appeared before a Justice of the he was aged sixty-eight years on that date (born about 1782).
- Benjamin Kent declared that he served as a private during the War of 1812 under Captain Edward McGrady in the 56th Regiment of the Virginia Militia. Benjamin stated he was drafted in about Aug. 1814 at Loudoun Co., Virginia and he was honorably discharged at Washington DC in about December 1814.
- This declaration was made in order to obtain any bounty land warrant due to him from his War of 1812 service.
- Benjamin Kent signed with his mark.
- On 09 April 1855 Benjamin Kent declared he was age 72 (born about 1783) and he was a resident of Pulaski, Williams, Ohio.
- Declared the first land warrant issued for 40 acres was transferred to Stephen Kent, then to E. Folsom[?].
- Albert M. Pratt, E. Langel[?] and Edward Foster, all residents of Bryan, William, Ohio testified on his behalf.
- Notation in file indicates Benjamin Kent's actual service was for three months and nineteen days.

## Records at the Bureau of Land Management website:

- Document No. 23921 was issued to Benjamin Kent, under the September 28, 1850: ScripWarrant Act of 1850 (9 Stat. 520). Land warrant was assigned to Seymour Donielson and was for 43.44 acres located in Eaton Co., Michigan.
- Benjamin Kent, Senior received land warrant no. 31,332 for 120 acres. Land warrant was transferred to Jester Hedge.
