Lancaster County Court June 17th 1833-

It is ordered that the order made the 18th of March last relative to the heirs of Daniel Kent deceased be amended in this that Daniel Kent an Ensign in the Virginia line in the Revolutionary war died intestate, and that no original will of said Daniel Kent or any copy of any such will was ever proved or offered for probate in this Court, and that Judith Curule daughter of the said Daniel Kent, Frances A. D. and Jane W. R. Edmonds children of Jane W. Edmonds who was a daughter of Daniel Kent, and Daniel Kent son of John Kent who was a son Daniel Kent are the only heirs at law of the said Daniel Kent.
