Any application for pension on account of service in the War of 1812, heretofore made under the act of Congress approved February 11, 1871, granting pensions, &c., or under sections 4736, 4737, 4738, Heretofore statutes, now pending or which stands adjourned, shall be treated as filed under the authority not approved March 9, 1878, upon the claimant filing with the Commissioner of Pensions a statement, signed by him or her in the presence of two subscribing witnesses, setting these out in detail, and requesting that the claim may be adjusted under the act of March 9, 1878. In such case new applications will not be required.

If a new application shall be filed under the act of March 9, 1878, by a person who has an application already on file for pension on account of service in the War of 1812, filed under the provisions of previous enactments, said new application will be considered with the old claim and taken for the whole heretofore mentioned.

The attorney in the claims heretofore filed will be recognized to prosecute said claims under the act of March 9, 1878, provided they call up and prosecute the case within six months after the passage of said act. A new attorney will not be recognized to prosecute any such claim unless, after having filed a power of attorney thereto, he shall be called upon to furnish further testimony to establish the claim.
