Dear Sister:

I received your letter dated the 22nd. That was my 79th birthday. Lizzie sent me a 5. Jennie 5. Fronie a dozen white China cups and saucers. Gusta a little low table for my plants, George a basket of peaches.

All I remember about Mother Kent's family is that her Father's name was Issi Fletcher. Mother, Margaret and Graham and Silas; these were her own sister and brothers. Aunt Susan, that was Buel Landon's mother, Jefferson and Judson were half brothers and sister. If I am not mistaken, one of her own brother's was killed some way and one married Arma (Anna?) Allen', they lived on South Street at the Lake then moved to Ogdensberg, I think.

Father had a brother Jacob. They lived 10 or 12 miles back of Flatsburg. He owned a saw mill there. I used to go with Father there and went to the saw mill on a corduroy road. That was one Sunday. They were eating dinner. Aunt Kate was tall and nice. Uncle Jacob was pretty well off once. He had 2 sons and 2 daughters, John and Feter, Folly and Sarah. They were a proud family and coaxed Uncle to sell and he went into the dry goods business and they ruined him. Father used to say they put it all on their backs.

Father's brother John, they had a large family. There was Helmer Jacob that lives in Grand Isle and Jim. There is more of them that I can't think of. And Father had a brother Peter. He used to go to Uncle Jacob's the most. He was the oldest brother.

I don't remember anything about this Lasher. I know Aunt Anna married a Palmer. Father did not think much of him. They were very poor. Aunt Kate married Daniels. Agnes is buried on the Island. That is all I know of the family. They were from New Jersey. William promised when here to write Jim 'ent and find out something of the family. These is right about Grandmother Payne. (She evidently meant Grandmother Payne Beach Kent Payne who was, I suppose, the Mother of Helmer kent, father of Jane Adams.) She was Dutch German; I expect we are on that side of the house.

The above copy of Jane Kent Adams letter was sent to Mrs. Jeorge f. Wells of South Hero, Vermont. She in turn sent a copy to Mrs. Allyene Brindley of Allegan, Michigan who in January, 1972, sent a copy to Esther Pains Austin. granddaughter of Margaret F. Kent Paine, in Portland, Oregon.

HELMER KENT md. HANNAH ALLEN in 1813. They had two children, JANE ANN and HELMER. HELMER, together with the mother died in June, 1815. I think they died in Plattsburg and were buried there.

After her Mother's death, JANE ANN went to live with her Grand-mother ALLEN. But she was lonesome and would stand at the gate and cry for her mother. So Mrs. ALLEN told the Father HELMER KENT that he must take her, which he did.

Later HELMER KENT md. SAMANTHA FLETCHER. She was Dau. of ISSI FLETCHER and JENNY GRAHAM. Her Grandfather, JOHN GRAHAM, fought in the Rev. War. He signed the Association Test in 1776 and afterwards served three years. He was then living in Hillsborough, N.H., but came to So. Hero, Vt. in 1781.

HELMER KENT built the Stone Hotel, now called the South Hero Inn, in 1829. He sold it in 1843 and moved back to his farm in South Hero, Vt.

HELMER KENT was rather tall, light hair and blue eyes. He was an ambitious man, full of energy, a blacksmith by trade. He had very little education, although his step-father was a school teacher. He told of going to school when a small boy, and part pf two terms after that, but had very little real education. But he kept his accounts and one never heard of errors.

Soon after HELMER KENT sold the Hotel, his eyes began to fail. Cataracts began to form. It was just as they were first trying to operate for cataracts. We heard of a doctor who had been successful in breaking them up and he and Mother went to see him. Mother stood by and helped during the operation. See him. Mother had lived in a hotel as a girl. Her father, ISSI FLETCHER had kept a Tavern at the place now owned by Miss CLARA TRACY. Grandfather's 2nd. Wife died the year before Father built our Hotel. That was why Mother knew how to manage so well, she had been used to it as a girl.

My birthday is recorded as Dec. 14, 1835. The Hotel where I was born and where we lived later is still standing. It is called South Hero Inn. Father built it in 1829, over 100 years ago. Not long after I was born, Father rented the hotel and we moved to the farm. Three or four years later they moved back to the hotel. Father sold the hotel and moved back to the farm when I was eight years old.

We had seven months of school during the year. In the fall, we frequently had a Select School at the Academy which had been built just a little ways from the Hotel. There we would meet the older boys and girls from the four public schools of the township. Sometimes students would come from across the Lake....."

ILLIAM KENT, a prominent farmer and stock-raiser residing on section 32, Dover Township, was born in South Hero, Grand Isle County, Vt., December 14, 1827. His parents were Helmer and Samantha Fletcher (Kent.) His father, a native of New Jersey. was born February 19, 1786, and first married Hannah Allen, who was born July 15, 1795, in Essex County, N. Y. They became the parents of two children: Jane Ann, who was born August 22, 1814, and is now Mrs. Adams, of Oshkosh, Wis.; and Helmer A., who was born June 8, 1816, and died in infancy.

Helmer Kent and Samantha Fletcher were joined in wedlock July 6,1817. The lady was born in South Hero, Grand Isle County, Vt., September 1, 1794, and unto them were born the following children: Munson F., the eldest, who was born January 7, 1820, in South Hero, Vt., was twice married and had seven children. He came to Iowa in 1855, locating on a farm in Fayette County where he died in September, 1868. Harriet, born September 17, 1824, died March 25, 1828; William, of this sketch, is the next younger; Phobe L., born March 24, 1830, on the 24th of April, 1853, became the wife of Winslow Stearnes, who is now deceased, and makes her home on a farm near Lima, Iowa. Unto them were born three children. Juliette, born September 7, 1832, married H. B. Hoyt, of West Union, Iowa, February 22, 1854, and died March 30,7 1875, leaving four children. Margaret F., born December 14, 1835, became the wife of Jason L. Paine, of Fayette, July 24, 1861, and their home is on a farm in this county. Five children were born unto them, four of whom are living. Warren, born October 12, 1838, died May 18, 1847. The father of this family died in South Hero, Vt., July 18, 1858, and the mother spent her last days in Fayette. Iowa, where her death occurred May 22, 1861.

In his native town William Kent spent the days of his boyhood and youth, and on the 20th of September, 1854, married Miss Julia Ann Hoyt, daughter of Daniel and Prua (Keeler) Hoyt, and a native of Connecticut, born in Ridgefield, Fairfield County, August 28, 1832. About three and a half years of their married life Mr. and Mrs. Kent spent in the East, and in April, 1858, came to Iowa, locating upon the farm in Fayette County which has since been their home. He built a log house in which they lived comfortably and happily for many years, but some time since it was replaced by a commodious residence of more modern style. The fine farm comprising three hundred and eighty-five acres is furnished with good buildings and all

the necessary improvements, and for the past fifteen years Mr. Kent has given considerable attention to the raising of fine stock, making a specialty of Short-horn cattle. He now has a herd of seventy head of thorough-bred Short-horns and at the county fairs has taken many premiums. His home with its entire surroundings is typical of that thrift and economy which follows the New Englander wherever he goes.

Six children have been born of the union of Mr. and Mrs. Kent and the family circle yet remains unbroken, though some of the children have left the parental roof for homes of their own: Gertrude E., who was born in South Hero, Vt., January 19, 1856, was married in West Union, October 18, 1882, to John J. Shaw, who is engaged in the hardware business in Emmetsburg, Iowa, where they reside. They have one son and one daughter; Addison H., born October 25, 1857, in South Hero, Vt., married Clara McCleery, of this county, September 22, 1881, and resides on a farm in Union Township; Carrie A., born May 22, 1859, in this county, became the wife of John W. Blunt, in West Union, December 20, 1886, and their home is on a farm in Union Township; Hardy W., born March 8, 1862, married Grace E. Tyler. June 26, 1889, by whom he has one child, and is associated in business with his brother-in law, J. J. Shaw, of Emmetsburg. Herbert A., born July 16, 1866, in Dover Township, is still at home; Cora A., born on the old home farm, October 8, 1868, attended the public schools of the neighborhood and completed her education in the High School of West Union. The other children were educated in the public schools and at the Upper Iowa University, of Fayette.

Mr. Kent is a public-spirited and enterprising citizen. He has always taken an interest in everything to enhance the welfare of his town and county, and has held the office of Treasurer in the school district for the past twelve years, while for more than twenty years he has been connected with the school board. He has also served his township as Assessor and Census Enumerator and in other offices of trust and responsibility. Mr. Kent has been a stanch Republican in politics ever since the Civil War, previous to which time he voted the Democratic ticket. A third of a century has passed since he came to Iowa, and during that entire time he has resided upon one farm.

JAMES W. KENT and his Wife ANN S. ALLEN KENT came to Mich in 1848 as DAVID was born here. JAMES W. KENT was a Blacksmith and lived in Allegan for some time, having his shop there.

He liked to do skilled work, my Father had a pair of ear-rings hammered from gold, and I have a pair of skates, wooden base, and steel runners, also a chopping knife he made.

He bought land in Trowbridge Township and moved there. The house is still standing (1967). He gave each of his children an equivalent of 40 acres. ANN ALLEN KENT died Oct. 25, 1869 after they moved to the farm. My Uncle JIM's place was next to his brother's, my brother DAVID, had his farm about ½ mile, on a lake, and the lake was named after a settler by the name of MINCKLER, who I can just remember. He had three sons, WARREN, REUBEN, and SOLON MINCKLER. WARREN md. one of EUNICE (KENT) & JAMES FOSTER's daus., 2nd. mrg. for both. WARREN & SOLON died without issue, but REUBEN's Grandsons or maybe Grt.-Grandsons are Real Estate dealers in Kalamazoo, Mich.

Another thing I wonder about - when I knew GUY ALLEN, he was single. His Wife is listed as LURA ROCKWELL, now, I'm wondering if she was related to the JAMES ROCKWELL who md. SYLVIA KENT? Getting these names brings up questions in my mind. I've written VERA, dau. of AMANDA (KENT) & GUS GATES, to see if she knows anything about the family. Her Mother was a great gatherer of information but if VERA kept them or not. Probably, as she lives in the same house as her Mother shared with her. But as is often the case, there was some dissatisfaction that we got the Bible, at that time. It was in Uncle JIM's family, his Wife HARRIET making most of the entries and some are so faded it is hard to make them out. I will make an effort to get a list of the next generation, that is, my cousin's children and maybe years born. I know all the cousins' names except one family, Aunt EUNICE and Uncle JAMES FOSTER, they never met at our family groups. In fact, I don't remember Aunt EUNICE. Maybe they lived away from here. Anyway I've written my cousin about it. She had different family relationship.

"Death of Mrs. J. R. ROCKWELL"

At 8:35 o'clock Monday morning, at her home at Ely-st., occurred the death of Mrs. J. R. ROCKWELL. She had been ill since Jam. 9, just eight months, of cancer, and death was a welcome relief from her sufferings, though she bore tehm patiently.

Mrs. ROCKWELL's maiden name was SYLVIA ANN KENT. She was born in Grand Isle, Grand Isle Co., Vt. Aug. 5, 1835. In the spring of 1848, she came to Allegan (Mich.) with her parents, Mr. & Mrs. J. W. KENT, and may justly be termed a pioneer.

Sept. 9, 1855, she was united in marriage to JAMES R. ROCKWELL. Three sons and two **gaus** were born to them. Two of the former, EDWARD A. (ROCKWELL) and JOHN W. (ROCKWELL), are living. The third son WILLIAM R. (ROCKWELL) died March 10, 1891.

One of the daughters, ANNELLA ENDORA (ROCKWELL) died in infancy in Oct. 3, 1861, and the other, OLIVE ANN (ROCKWELL), died April 7, 1871, aged 7 years.

Two brothers, JAMES W. KENT and DAVID H. KENT of Trowbridge, and three sisters, Mrs. J. J. RUSSELL of Trowbridge, Mrs. AUGUSTUS GATES of Monterey, and Mrs. J. M. FOSTER of Battle Creek (Mich.) survive.

Mrs. ROCKWELL was a resident of Allegan (Mich.) from the time of her coming here, except during five years spent in Leadville and Robinson, Colorado, to which state she went in the spring of 1879, her husband having gone there previously. She was the first woman resident of Robinson, Colo., then a rough mining town. Mr. ROCKWELL conducted a hotel during their residence there, six months. She was a great-granddaughter to Col. ETHAN ALLEN of Revolutionary War fame.

It will be noted that she died on the 40th. anniversary of her wedding and within two hours of the time the cermony was performed. She was a woman of many virtues, and hosts of friends attest the esteem in which she was held. She was a member of the M. E. Church and of the W. R. C. The funeral was held from the house at 5 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, under conduct of Rev. J. C. COOK. Those present from out of town besides the brothers and sisters, were J. M. FOSTER of Battle Creek and Mrs. S. S. THOMAS of Ionia.

I have not had only 2 or 3 when the scholars went on their sleigh ride I went and we had a jolly time of it - we rode about 20 miles in the afternoon - Mr. MUNGER wants I teach school in his district next summer up by eagle lake but do not know whether I shall or not - we have moved into our new house although it is not finished off but it would have been had not Father lent his lime and although he had the promise of a speedy return but we hope to get it finished off in the spring - and then it is such a pleasant place how can I help but feel happy then how Irish that you could come and see me.

Mother's old friend and playmate LUCIA GREGGS boys were at out house a week or two ago - she is in Ohio now but intends moving out here in the spring or at least about 30 miles from here - she will doubtless stop here on her way out - do write soon and not wait as I did - forgive me for this - my love to all - our folks all send their love and may the blefsings of God be on you is the sincere wish of your affectionate EUNICE

I have just concluded to write some more - you must not forget to write and tell me where PHEOBE is and whether JULIETTE is married or not - but I strongly suspect she is and you for that matter - tell me all the news and about little RUTH ANN CONRO now grown to be a large girl I expect - I have never received any letters from her and never shall I expect - our folks are all well and I seincerly hope that these few miserable lines will find you all enjoying the same blefing.





WOODS, thence East 32 rods on the road leading to the Sand Bar, thence South from the last mentioned bounds far enough to contain three acres of land, being bounded on the West by land Deeded from BEN-JAMIN BOARDMAN to WILLIAM V. WOODS, being part of the lot of land laid to the original right of SOLOMON STANTON

(this complaint continues that ASA ROBINSON did not have a clear title to the land and had no rights to sell it, etc., to the damages to HELMER KENT of \$1200.00)

The case went to the Grand Isle County Court on the Sept. Term, 1818 Docket. The record is marked "Discontinued by agreement of parties".

The above record is of some interest, that \$600.00 for 3 acres of land, etc., was a very substantial sum in 1817. One wonders at the ability of HELMER KENT to contract himself for such an amount. Another record in 1808, tells of his being unable to pay a personal Note of \$6.86, and being committed to the Debtor's Goal for the lack of paying. (ALS)

The following Divorce Petition of MERCY (SMITH) KENT against JOHN W. KENT - is for possible future records re' "KENT Family"

Just who JOHN W. KENT was or his relationship is not known at this time by this compiler – that perhaps he was of the Platts-burgh KENT Family, that he knew HELMER KENT of South Hero quite well.

In 1834, FRANKLIN ROBINSON of South Hero, states that he saw JOHN W. KENT in Burlington, Vt., but knows nothing else.

The Bill for Divorce was dismissed at the Jany. Term 1836 of the Gr. Is. Co. Supreme Court. Whether any later further action is not known.

MERCY about 1½ yr. after the marriage...that he lived with me some time in the year 1829 in South Hero...that he had then left his Wife for good and has never lived with her or provided for her support. I have heard by letters from JOHN W. KENT of Burlington, Vt. since that time.

I, HEMAN SMITH of Plattsburgh, N.Y. depose and say....that MERCY SMITH md. JOHN W. KENT in the fall of 1825, and he immediately afterward left his wife and went to the State of Georgia (as he said when he returned) and returned in the Spring following and remained with his Wife in Plattsburgh until the winter following, and then left her for good to parts unknown to me.From the time of their mrg. which was secretly performed, he has never in any manner supported his Wife MERCY, that she supported him when he was home in 1826 about 8-10 months. I am informed he is now married and living in Mississippi Jany. 3, 1835 (signed) MEMA. Manu

Share Granted to me, the said CEPHAS KENT, being the original Grantee of said right and granted, sold to the said JEDEDIAH HYDE.

HELMER KENT on Jan. 17, 1810, gave his Note for the payment to CHAUNCEY PEARL, of four good warranted exes to weigh 5½ lbs. each. CHAUNCEY PEARL was a Wagon Maker in South Hero. For some reason HELMER KENT failed to make the "payment" of the four exes - so on April 12, 1810 CHAUNCEY PEARL brings an action against HELMER KENT to recover.

The Writ of Attachment in this Action reads as follows:

Grand Isle County, State of Vermont, South Hero April 22, 1810
I served this Writ by attaching one half acre of Land and a small house standing thereon being situated South a few rods of a certain barn which is now owned by WILLIAM LAMPSON, formally by JOSEPH DICKSON & Deeded by sd. DICKSON to sd. LAMPSON, said half acre of Land & small house is now occupied by HELMER KENT & lies on the East side of the Road which leads from the "Four Corners" to Col. ALLEN's & is part of the Right of SHADRACK HATHAWAY.....said property as turned out to me as owned by HELMER KENT......
