Solon Harrington } in consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars
in hand paid by Solon Harrington do hereby remise
release & forever quit claim unto the said Solon Harrington his heirs
& assigns forever all our title interest & estate legal & equitable
in the following premises with the appurtenances Situate in
Union County State of Ohio on the waters of Dorbys creek and
bounded & described as follows, Beginning at two bur oak
& a Hickory the most westerly corner of Survey No 7393, of three
hundred & thirteen acres of land which said Sum & wife conveyed
to James Russell on the 13th day of June 1827, thence S 8° 20' W
14 1/2 four poles to three Hickories in the original line of the
original Survey of which the land now conveyed is a part. Thence
N 8 W 34 1/2 poles to an Elm in the north line of the said original
Survey thence with said line S 70 E ten poles to black oak & a
bur oak a corner to said Survey. Thence with another of its lines
N 75° 30' E 50 poles to a Stake in a prairie in said line, thence
S 8° E 246 poles to a Stake & Bur oak in a line of Russells said
land, thence with said line S 52 W thirty three poles to three
bur oaks, one of his corners, thence with another of his lines
N 15 W 32 poles to the Beginning containing one hundred acres of
land be the same more or less being a part of Survey No 7916,
as it is described on the principle Surveyors Book which was
patented to Walter Sumner on the 4 day of Oct 1815. In Testimony
whereof we have hereunto set our hands and seals this 18th day of
November 1846.
