- On 13 August 1855, Jane Kent, widow of Jacob Kent, was age 77 (born about 1778) was a resident of Ascot, Sherbrooke, Canada East.
- Jacob Kent served as a substitute for Samuel Winslow, Jr.
- Both were residents of Lyndon, Caledonia, Vermont.
- Jacob Kent's Discharge Papers were probably burnt when their house in Lyndon, Vermont was consumed by fire.
- Jane Kent was known as Jenny Winslow when she married Jacob Kent at Lyndon on 20 February 1799.
- Jane Kent signed with her signature.
- On 25 October 1858, Blasdel Kent of Ascot of the area formerly known as Lower Canada, made a declaration at Orleans Co., Vermont stating that he is the son of Jane Kent, and she lived with him when she received the land warrant under 1855 Act.
- Note: It appears that the land warrant was sold and subsequently lost. There are multiple declarations in file attesting to the chain of ownership of the land warrant.

On this 13<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. One thousand eight hundred  
and fifty five, personally appeared before me authorized to ad-  
minister oaths, for general purposes within and for the County  
aforesaid, Jane Kent aged 77 years a resident of West  
in the Province of Canada East who being duly sworn according  
to law declares that she is the widow of Jacob Kent deceased, who  
was a private in the company commanded by Captain Sam-  
uel A. Wheeler in the 2<sup>d</sup> Regiment in the 3<sup>d</sup> Brigade and 4<sup>th</sup>  
Division of Vermont detached Militia stationed at Derby Vermont  
in the year with Great Britain declared by the United States on the  
18<sup>th</sup> June A.D. 1812, that his service commenced to the best of my  
recollection the latter part of December A.D. 1812 or the fore-  
part of January A.D. 1813 and continued to about the middle  
of the month of March then next following a period as I believe  
of about two months and a half, that he entered said service as  
a substitute for Samuel Winslow my said husband and the said  
Samuel Winslow Junr. then both being residents of Lyndon in the  
County of Calhoun and State of Vermont, and that the end  
of said service by said husband the said Jacob Kent received  
an honorable discharge which she believes to have been burnt  
in their dwelling house which was consumed by fire when they  
resided at said Lyndon. —

The foregoing declaration and affidavit were sworn to and acknowledged before me on the day and year above written

She further states that she was married to the said Jacob Kent on the twentieth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven by our Daniel Cahoon Justice of the Peace at said Lyndon and that her name before her said marriage was, Jane Winslow but was sometimes familiarly called, Jenny Winslow; that her said husband died at Ascut of said on the thirteenth day of May A.D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven and that she now remains a widow.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which she may be entitled under the Act approved March 3<sup>d</sup> 1855

ain declared by the United States on the 18<sup>th</sup> June 1812  
That the Company into which I volunteered & served  
was the 6<sup>th</sup> Company, Samuel A. Wheeler Captain and  
~~in the~~ Regiment commanded by Edward Peabody  
Colonel — Said Company being under special command  
of Major Hacking Stary as field officer much of  
the time of the service which was for the period of  
six months and commenced the 12<sup>th</sup> day of  
September 1812. That when said service had about  
half expired but the precise time I cannot now  
recollect Jacob Kent, then of said Lyndon, now  
deceased and when living the husband of Jane  
Kent who is now his widow residing in Acet in  
the Province of Canada East whose name before her  
marriage with the said Jacob Kent was Jane Minlow, I  
found said Company as a soldier and performed military  
duty therein for about the space of three months &  
had an honorable discharge with the Company, a few  
years since I saw a roll of said Company in which I  
believe to have been one of the Original Rolls used when

I then made a deposition naming the persons concerned  
said Roll a copy of which I have recently seen &  
the name of said Jacob Kent is one of the numbers

That there was belonging to said Company at the time it  
was first stationed at said Derby a private soldier by the  
name of Thomas Pitman who had previously lived at Derby  
and Concord Vermont who remained in said Company but  
a few days when Samuel Winslow Junr. then of Vergennes in  
the County of Calichonia and State of Vermont now of  
Compton Canada East took his place as a substitute. I think  
as early as the first day of October A.D. 1812 and that said  
Winslow performed the service & duties of said station from  
the time he so took the place of said Pitman as a substitute.

to some time in the winter next after I feel certain until after the  
eighteenth day of December then must feel cannot say how  
much longer. Why I am certain as to the 18<sup>th</sup> day of December is  
that I had a furlough on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of said December of ten  
days absence and that said Winslow was present on  
duty when I returned to Camp at which said furlough expired.  
The period of said Winslow's service as known to me must have  
been nearly if not quite three months. Immediately upon said  
Winslow's leaving the said service Jacob Kent thus of said Regiment  
now deceased took his place in said Company and served  
out the remainder of said six months, which I believe to have  
been about two months and an half. Said Kent having joined  
said Company to the best of my recollection the last of December  
1812 or the first of January 1813. and my recollection is  
that our discharges from said service were dated March 16<sup>th</sup> 1813.  
I am confident that said Kent's service in said Company at  
that time must have exceeded two months, and I think  
the whole time I have named above. This Deposition  
is given in behalf of Mrs Jane Kent widow of the said Jacob  
Kent now a resident of Compton Canada East in aid  
of an application she may make for Bounty Land  
on account of the service of her said husband as aforesaid.

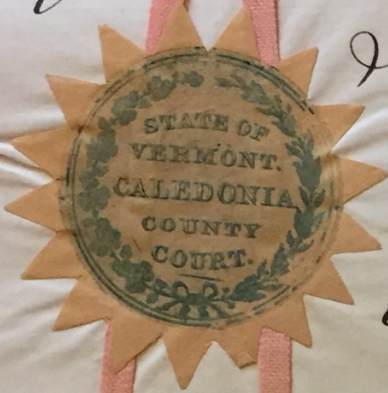

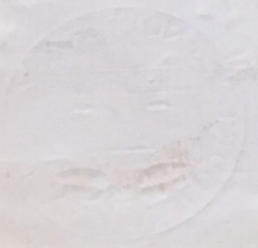

That he the said Richmond was in the Winter of 1836 and Spring of 1837 engaged with one Frederick Mott who is now in the State of Iowa but was then a resident of said Derby, Vermont, and who left all said business in the hands of said

Richmond in purchasing Land Warrants for William  
M. Dustin of Lincoln in the County of Logan  
and State of Illinois and that he purchased the  
Warrant above described of the said Levi Spalding  
and sent the same to the said W. M.  
Dustin who after receiving it sent it back to  
him the said Richmond enclosed in a letter  
dated May 5. 1837 in which he requested the  
said Richmond to obtain a different Certif-  
icate of the said Levi Spalding's Appointment  
as a Notary Public in the State of Missouri  
and that he the said Richmond knowing  
the Certificate to be sufficient caused the  
said Warrant to be immediately remailed to  
the said Dustin and that he is informed  
and believes that the said Warrant never  
reached the hands of said Dustin but has  
been lost.

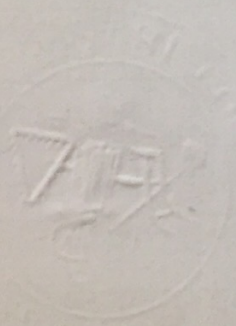

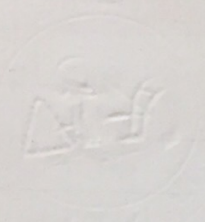

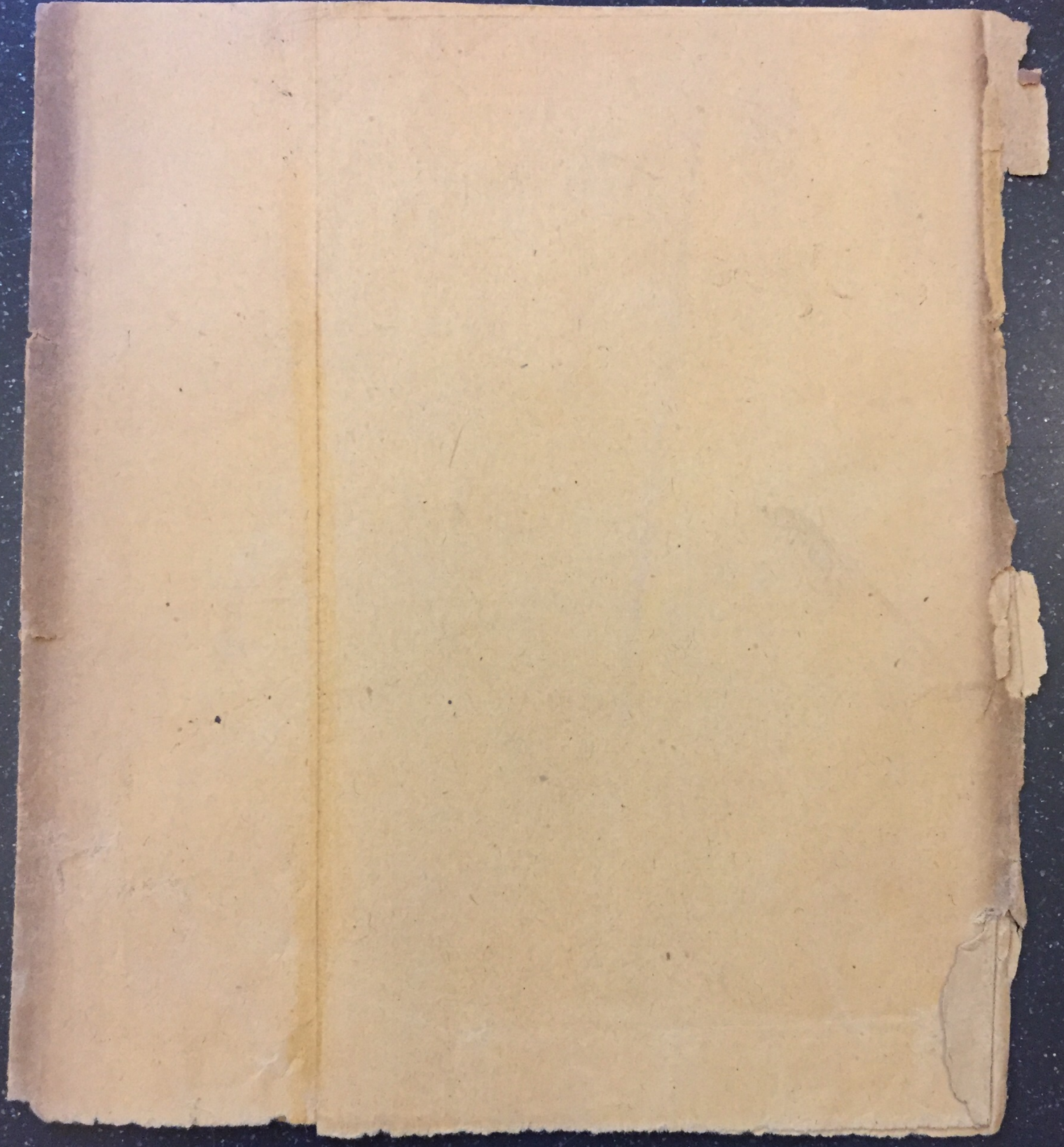
