[No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.*]

Said *Amos Kent* was born in *New York City* in the State of *New York* is *fourteen* years of age, *five* feet *one* inches high, *Fair* complexion, *azel* eyes, *Brown* hair, and by occupation, when enlisted, a *Musician*

GIVEN at *Camp Crawford Laredo, Texas,* this *Third* day of *December* 1849.

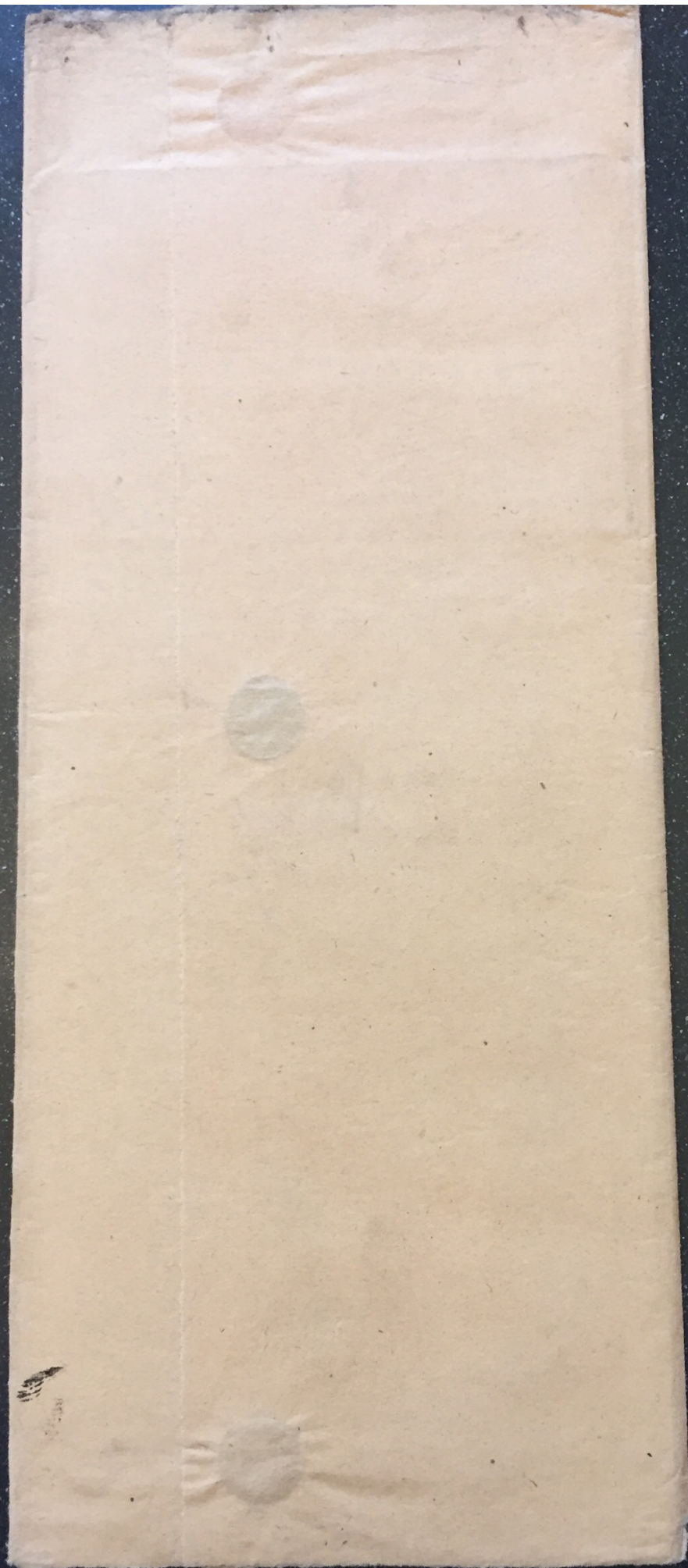

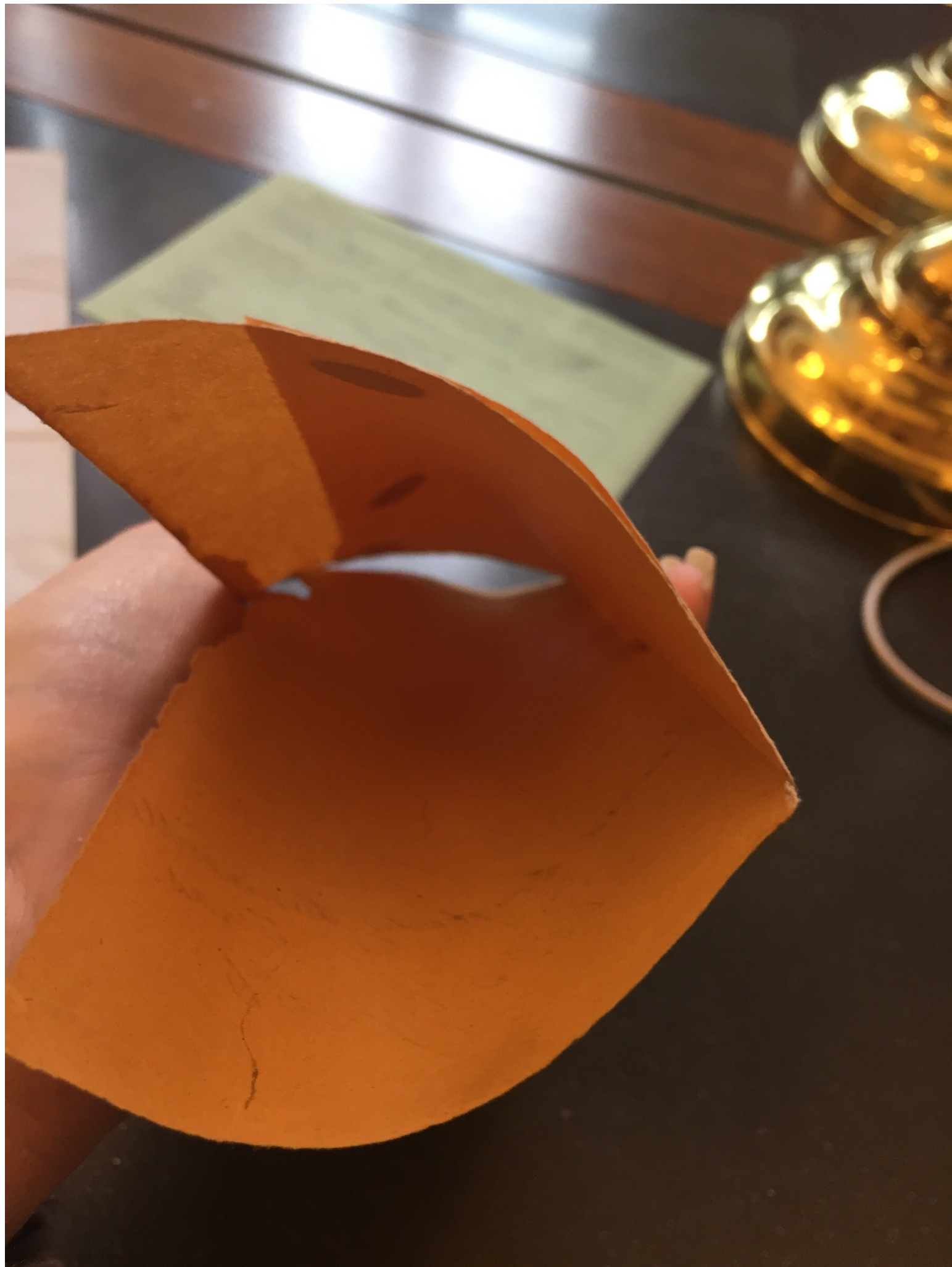

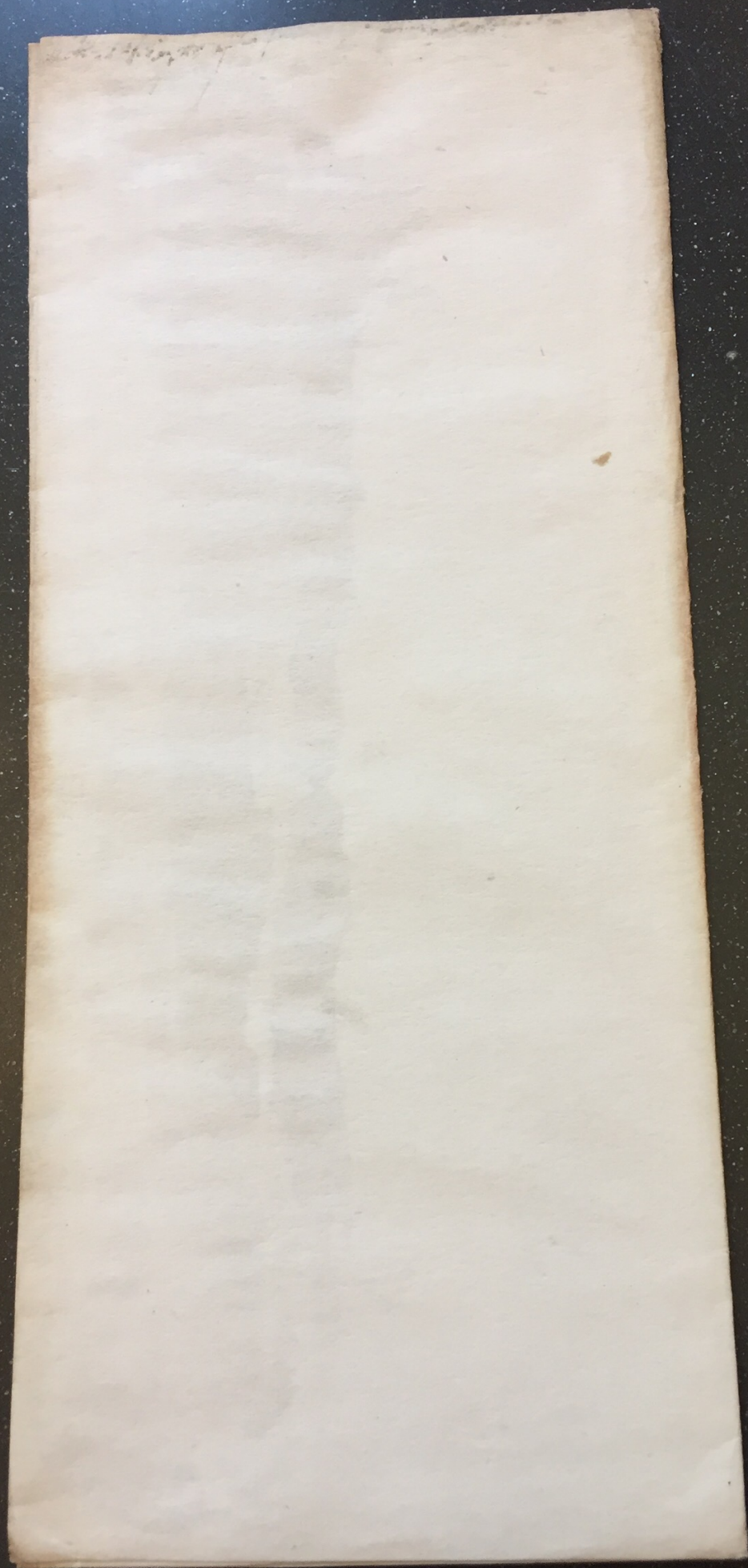
