Notes after a cursory review of file by Michelle M. Roy, Jan. 2015:

- By 15 Sept. 1851, Mary (Carrico) Kent was widowed.
- Mary (Carrico) Kent was aged 64 on Sep 16, 1851 and resided at Fauquier County, VA.
- James Kent and Mary Carrico were married 14 Dec. 1815.
- James Kent was drafted about 01 May 1814 at Leesburg, Loudon Co., Virginia for six months.
- James Kent was discharged at Norfolk on 01 Nov 1814.
- James Kent died 14 May 1824 at his residence in Loudon Co., Virginia.
- Thomas H. Carrico provided copy of family bible.
