## KENT. J.V.

J.V. KENT was State Representative from this district elected in 1932, served three terms until term ended in 1938. He was born in Sugar Creek Township, Clinton County, on January 28, 1887. He was the son of ADRIAN B. KENT and EMMA A. MAISH. They had four children: GEORGE A., JAMES V. ORA, and DAVID V.

GEORGE A. KENT married SARAH BOYLES. They are the parents of: ADRIAN KENT, HONORABLE JAMES V. KENT, WILLIAM KENT, BYRON KENT, MARTHA KENT (married JOHN FRAIZER), MARY ELLEN KENT (married MICHAEL WALTERS), EMMA KENT (married DAVID DOW), and MINERVA KENT (married WILLIAM JENKINS).

The ancestor of J.V. Kent was born in England and died in Rochester, Massachusetts around 1656. They were progressive people and great politicians. They were ancestors of Lucinda Starkweather, one of the famous Starkweather family of Massachusetts.

JAMES V. KENT married SYLVIA A. GOFF on August 3, 1911, daughter of J. CURT GOFF, a large land owner of Johnson Township. Mr. Goff owned about 1,100 acres of land East of Hillisburg and raised Belgian horses. James V. and Sylvia Kent lived on the old Goff homestead before retiring to Hillisburg.
