Notes after a cursory review of file by Michelle M. Roy, Feb. 2015:

- On 21 April 1851, Daniel Kent was 35 years old (born about 1816) and he was a resident of Butler Co., Alabama.
- On May 4, 1855 Daniel Kent was 40 years old (born about 1815).
- He was a resident of Butler Co., Alabama
- Widow was Sarah "Sallie" A. (Spurlock) Kent. They were married 16 June 1839 in Barbour Co., Alabama by Jarreth Williams (JP).
- She lived as a widow at Live Oak, Alabama.
- Julius D. Kent died 27 July 1861 at Butler Co., Alabama.
- Julius Daniel's brother was James L. Kent of Cross Lake, Caddo Parish, Louisiana. His brother gave an affidavit on 07 August 1878 that he served with Julius Daniel Kent and he was also present at the wedding ceremony for Julius Daniel and Sarah A. (Spurlock) Kent.
- Their son, Samuel R. Kent, was born 04 January 1848. He lived at Cross Lake, Caddo Parish, Louisiana.
- In addition to Samuel R. Kent, they had three daughters that were still minors as of 03 March 1855 (date of statute for bounty land): 1) Sarah Ann Kent, born 30 June 1841; 2) Delilah Ann Kent, born 28 June 1843; and 3) Elizabeth Jane Kent, born 18?? [cut-off].
- It appears as though the 40 acres issued by land warrant no. 45,247 was submitted by soldier, Julius D. Kent (as opposed to selling warrant), at the land office in Cahaba, Alabama.
- Sarah "Sallie" A. (Spurlock) Kent was a pensioner on behalf of her deceased husband.

There must be some mistake in reference to J Daniel Kent getting his land Warrant - The letter says two warrants were issued, one for 40 and one for 120 acres - Kent's sisters and other parties who knew Kent from Boy hood & when he returned from the Indian War, say that Kent said he never had received his warrants, tho they may have been issued.

This is a fact that he has never owned no land except some purchase from Parties in this Co. His Widow is very poor, and we are seeking this information gratuitously - Will you kindly give us the date from which we can trace these warrants if they were ever placed by anyone, or transferred. In fact, we wish the information that will satisfy the Widow if Kent ever got and sold his warrants, or if any one ever got them for him. Kent before he died denied any knowledge of ever having received any warrants. Any information that will help in our investigation will be very gratifying to the widow.

D. Kent is the identical (2) Julius Daniel Kent who was a (3) private in Captain Moses G. Bush's Company Militia, commanded by Colonel Currie in the Florida war with Great Britain, declared by the United States, on the 18th day of June 1819

That he (4) Volunteered at Guntonton in the State of Alabama on or about the day of May 1835 for the term of two years and was honorably discharged at Guntonton on or about the day of 1837, and in addition thereto he claims for travel miles from the place of organization of said Company to the place of discharge, and miles from the place of discharge of said Company to the place of its organization.

That his parents (2) J. D. Kent and Sallie Spurlock were married at Barbour Co Ala on the 16th day of June 1839 by one Jarrett Williams Justice of Peace that his father (2) Julius D. Kent died at Butler Co Ala on the 27th day of July 1861 that his mother (7) is dead

he further states that he was born at Butler Co Ala on the fourth day of January 1848, that he has surviving brothers sisters that was under twenty-one years of age on the 3d day of March, 1855, whose names and date of birth are as follows:

(5) Sarah Ann Kent born June 30/41. Delilah Ann Kent born June 28/43. Elizabeth Jane Kent born, And he further states that he believes there is a public record of his parents' marriage and birth, there is private or family record (6) of J. D. Kent now living was present at the marriage

he makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which he is entitled under the act of MARCH 3, 1855, and MAY 14, 1856, never having received Bounty Land, or knowing that he is entitled except for the above service, and he hereby constitutes and appoints O. H. Waller of Sumner Co Iowa attorney, irrevocable, with power of substitution, to prosecute his claim and procure his warrant, revoking and countermanding all former authority that may have been given for the above specified purpose.

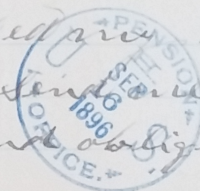

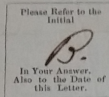

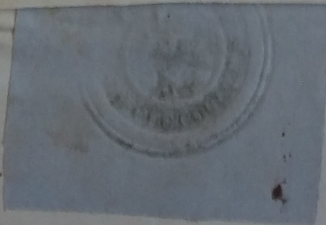
