thousand eight hundred and fifty personally appeared before
me a circuit Court Commissioner within and for the county
and State aforesaid Lewis Kent aged fifty eight years a
resident of Airedon in the State of Michigan who being duly sworn
according to law declares that he is the identical Lewis Kent
who was a private & Sergeant in the company com-
manded by Captain Samuel Jennings in the regiment
under the command of Col. Philetus Swift in the
New York line of volunteers in the war with Great Britain
declared by the United States on the 18th day of June 1812
that he volunteered at Palmyra State of New York
on or about the first day of April AD 1812 for the
term of one year and continued in actual service
in said war for the term of six months and was
honorably discharged at Black Rock, in the State of New York
on the 10th day of October AD 1812 as will appear
by the muster rolls of said Company and this
deponent further states on his oath that he is the
identical Lewis Kent who was a Sergeant in the
company commanded by Captain Job B. Clark in
the regiment under the command of Col. Silas
Kopkins in the war with Great Britain declared
by the United States on the 18th day of June 1812 that
he volunteered at Palmyra in the State of New York
on or about the 10th day of May AD 1813 for the
term of six months and continued in actual
service in said war for the term of at least six
months and was honorably discharged at Fort
George in the Province of Upper Canada on the
25th day of December AD 1813, as will appear
by the muster rolls of said Company and this
deponent further states that in both cases has

last his discharges He makes this declaration
for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to
which he may be entitled under the act granting
bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who
have been engaged in the military service of
the United States passed September 28th 1850


