- On 20 December 1850, Nicholas Kent was age 65 (born about 1785) and a resident of Coshocton Co., Ohio.
- He was drafted from Huntington, Pennsylvania in April 1814. [Note from MMR: There is a Huntingdon in Huntingdon Co., Pennsylvania and one in Adams Co., Pennsylvania.
- Nicholas Kent signed with his mark.

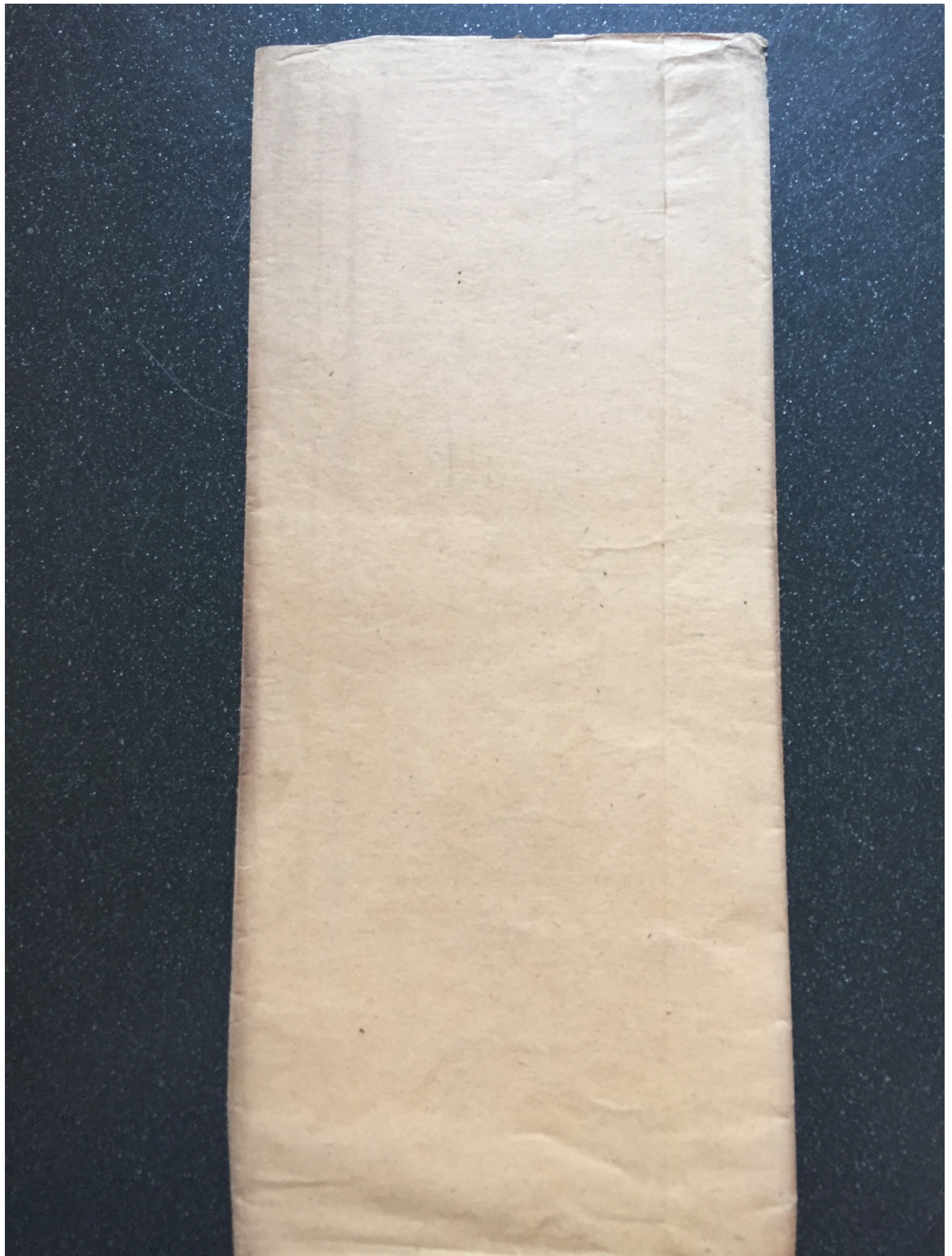

BOUNTY LAND CLAIM.


FORM OF DECLARATION FOR SURVIVING OFFICER OR SOLDIER.

The State of Ohio, COSHOCTON COUNTY, SS.

On this twentieth day of December A. D. 1850
PERSONALLY APPEARED, before me George H. Linsingham a Justice
of the Peace duly authorized to administer oaths within and for the County and State aforesaid
Nicholas Kent aged sixty five years, a resident of
Coshocton County in the State of Ohio, who being duly sworn according
to law, declares that he is the identical Nicholas Kent who was a
private in the Company commanded by Captain McMurray
in the Green Regiment of Pennsylvania Militia commanded by
a Colonel whose name he does not recollect the Major was named in the war with Great Britain declared by the
United States June 18th 1812 that he was drafted at Huntington Pennsylvania
on or about the middle day of April A. D. 1814 for the term
of six months and continued in actual service in said war for the term of four
months and was honorably discharged at Lake Erie, Pennsylvania about the
last day of August A. D. 1814 on account of there
being no farther need of his services as will appear by the Rolls on file at
Washington City. He has lost his discharge if he had one

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which he may be en-
titled under the "Act granting bounty lands to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged
in the military service of the United States," passed September 28th, 1850.

I sworn to and subscribed before me the day and year above written. And I hereby certify that
I believe the said Nicholas Kent to be the identical man who served as
aforesaid, and that he is of the age above stated:

POWER OF ATTORNEY.

Know all Men by these Presents, That Nicholas Kent
of the County of Coshocton and State of Ohio, have constituted and appoin-
ted, and by these presents do constitute and appoint Sam. Moses Hoagland
my true and lawful Attorney irrevocably for me and in my name to receive from the United States
the Bounty Land Certificate or Warrant, or Pension Certificate, and all such sum or sums of money
due me on account of arrears of pay, three months extra pay, or any money or moneys which may be
due me from the United States on any account whatsoever, and generally to do all lawful acts and
things whatsoever touching the premises, and an Attorney under him for the purposes aforesaid, to

make and at his pleasure revoke, hereby confirming all and whatsoever my said attorney shall in my name legally do or cause to be done in and about the premises.
