



This Indenture made and concluded the 26th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand 813; Two ^{hundred} eight hundred and thirty six between William Long of the County of Union and State of Ohio of the one Part and Oly Kent of the County and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Long for and in consideration of the sum of Nine hundred dollars to him in hand paid the Receipt Whereof he doth hereby acknowledge both granted Bargained sold Enfranchised and Confirmed and by these Presents doth grant Bargain sell Enfranchise and Confirm unto the said Oly Kent her him and assigns forever a Certain lot or tract of Land Containing one hundred and seventeen acres and fifty Poles be the same more or less Situate between the little Miami and siata Rivers in the County of Union and State of Ohio being part of a Military Survey No 5126 on the water of Darby Creek Bound and described as follows to wit Beginning at a Hickory and two ashes thence N 52 E 208 poles and 13 links Crossing Sugar Run at 202 poles to two Plm thence S 88 E 90 poles to a Stake in the Dublin Road thence S 52 W 208 poles to a maple Red Elm and Blue Beach thence N 33 W 90 poles to the Place of Beginning together with all the improvements and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any way appertaining to have and to hold all the Land hereby conveyed with appurtenances thereof unto the said Oly Kent her him and assigns forever and the said William Long and his heirs all the Premises hereby conveyed unto the said Oly Kent and her him against himself the said William Long and his heirs and against the Lawful Claim or Claims of all and Every other Person or Persons Whomsoever Claiming under or otherwise with and with forever Warrant and defence by these Presents In Testimony Whereof the said William Long together with Phoby his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year first above written
