On the 4th day of June A.D.  
1853 before me the undersigned a Justice  
of the Peace duly authorized by law to admin-  
ister oaths within and for the county and  
State aforesaid personally appeared Orrin  
Kent aged fifty nine years, a resident  
of the Town of Murren in the County of Salem  
and State of Illinois who being duly  
sworn according to Law declares that  
he is the identical person who was a  
private in the company commanded by  
Captain Hubbard in the regiment com-  
manded by General Collins in the war with  
Great Britain in 1812, that he entered  
into the service at Public Square in  
Onondaga County in the State of New York  
in the fore part of August 1814 and  
continued in actual service in said  
war for the term of fourteen days, and  
was honorably discharged at Sacketts  
Harbor in the State of New York in the  
month of November 1814.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of  
obtaining the bounty land to which he may  
be entitled on account of said service under  
the act approved 3<sup>d</sup> of March A.D. 1853, he  
also declares that he has never received  
or applied for any warrant under this or  
any other act of Congress.

He hereby appoints Samuel Biddlecom of the  
Town of Huntsgan in the County of Salem and  
State of Illinois his true and lawful



attorney with power of substitution to  
present this his claim for land, to  
receive the certificate or warrant when  
issued and to do all other acts necessary  
and proper in the premises

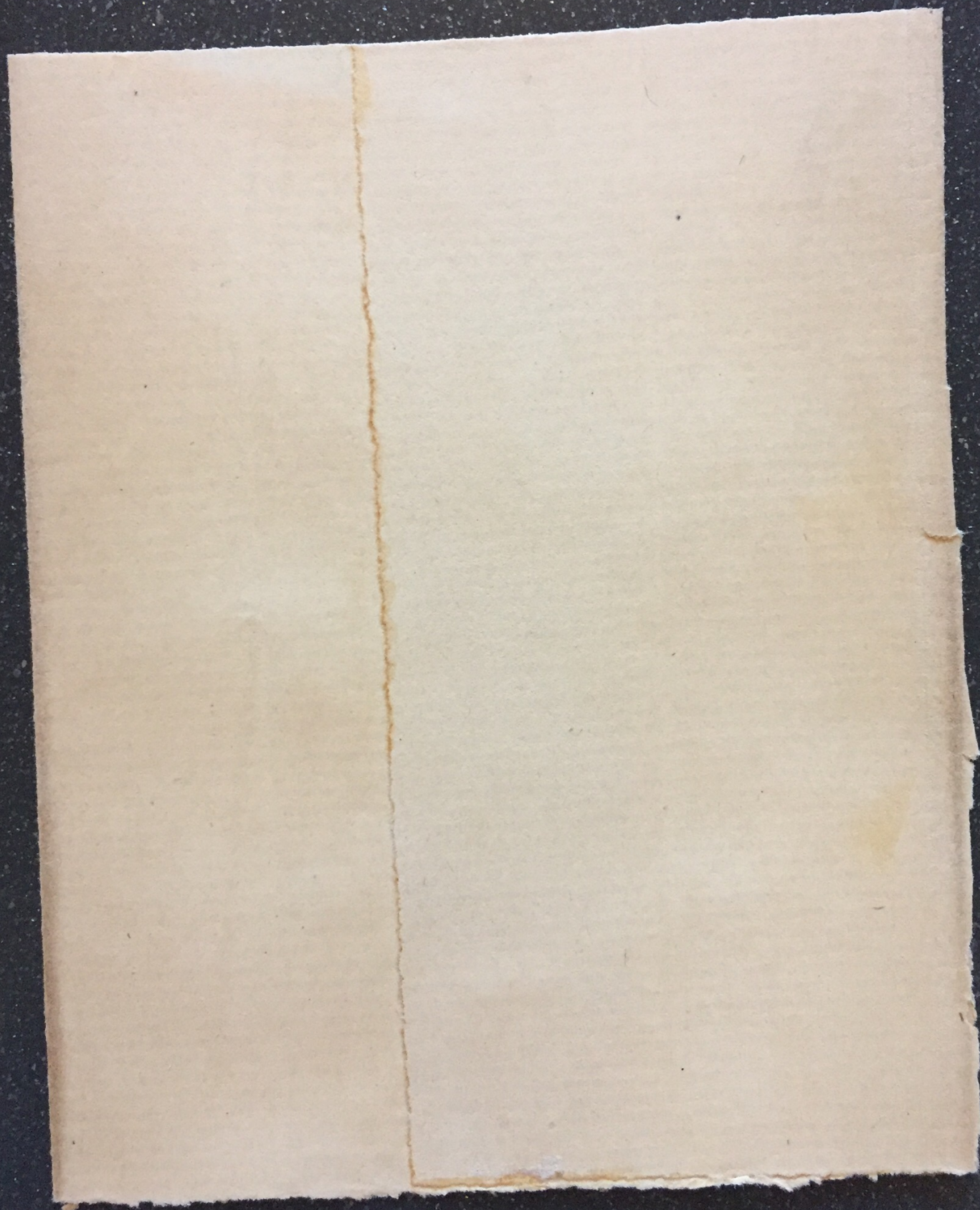
