DECLARATION FOR PENSION.

On this 17th day of March A. D. one thousand eight hundred and

aged 76 years, a resident of Covington P. O., in the
County of Fountain, and State of Indiana, who being duly
sworn according to law, declares that he is married, that his wife's name was

on the day of, 18, that he served the full
period of sixty days in the Military service of the United States in the war of 1812,
that he is the identical Perrin Kent who was Enrolled
in Captain John McKinsey's Company, of the Ohio Vols.
Regiment, of the Brigade, of the Division, at
Ross County Ohio, in the State of Ohio, on the
17th day of April, 1813, and was honorably discharged at
Upper Sandusky, on the 9th day of August
1813; that he started from Ross County, Ohio, then on
to Lower Sandusky, and was stationed
at Fort Stephenson, and was at service
under General Harrison at the time of
the Battle of Fort Stephenson August 5th
1813. No of Land Warrants. 1st for 80. = 43,351 1/2
that he at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States, adhered to the
cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them no aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of
any office whatever under any authority or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States, and
that he will support the Constitution of the United States; that he is not in receipt of a pension under
any previous act; that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the Pension Roll
of the United States, under the provisions of the act approved February 14, 1871, he hereby appoints
with full power of substitution and revocation, W. H. Stilwell
of Covington Indiana, his true and lawful attorney, to prosecute his claim
and obtain the Pension Certificate that may be issued. That his postoffice address is
Covington, County of Fountain and State of
Indiana, and his domicile or place of abode is Six miles west of Covington Ind.

A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty one, personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace within and for the County of Fountain and State aforesaid Perrin Kent aged fifty six years a resident of Warren County in the State of Indiana, who being by me duly sworn according to law declares that he is the identical Perrin Kent who was a private in the company commanded by Capt John McHenry in the Battalion commanded by Major Harpu and after rendezvousing at Franklinton in the State of Ohio was attached to Captain — McEwain's Rifle company from Fayette county in the State of Ohio in the Battalion commanded by Major — Harpu and subsequently after arriving at Ft Stephenson at Lower Sandusky the command devolved upon Trust Major — Vance, in the ^{war} with Great Britain, declared by the United States on the 18th day of June 1812. That he was drafted at Brumbidge Mass county Ohio on or about the 15th day of April A.D. 1813 for no particular term of time and continued in actual service until some time about the 15th or 20th of August 1813. was honorably discharge at Upper Sandusky for a full six months tour of duty.
