NOTES FROM MICHELLE M. ROY, JULY 2013:

- Thomas Kent was a Private and a Cook in the Ohio Volunteer Infantry, 66th Regiment, Company F.
- Pension request was due to a permanently disabled arm that was broken from an unsolicited attack by another soldier from the Ohio 5th Regiment. Witnesses confirmed he was attacked without provocation.
- His marriage with Mary (Moore) Kent was the first marriage for both of them.
- A witness, Harvey Moore, was a resident of Nashville, Brown, Indiana he was age 51 on 28 June 1892.
- Thomas and Mary (Moore) Kent lived in Union Co., Ohio in 1864, shortly after 1865 they moved to Brown Co.,

That at the time of his discharge from said service, he was a Private in Company E, in said 66<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Ohio Vol Infantry, that while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, at or near a place called Columbia, in the State of South Carolina, on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of February, A.D., 1865, he

was with said Company and Regiment in camp near said place and was out gathering wood to build fire to cook supper for said Company, and while so engaged a soldier belonging to the 5<sup>th</sup> Ohio Infantry approached him and without any provocation whatever struck him a blow with a club across the right forearm, breaking both the bones of said arm just above the wrist, which has so crippled declarant that he is unable to use said arm for any purposes of manual labor; that said soldier was drunk at the time he struck him; that no words whatever passed between him & said soldier and he was not aware until he had received the blow that said soldier intended striking him. That he has never been treated in any hospital for said injury, that Surgeon Haines of the 29<sup>th</sup> Ohio Inf. dressed his arm after said injury.

That since leaving the service of the United States, he has resided in the town of New Doors, in the County of Union, and State of Ohio, and has followed no occupation.

That his Post Office Address is New Doors Union Co Ohio

He makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the Invalid Pension Roll of the United States, by reason of the disability hereinbefore described, and hereby constitutes and appoints H. B. Wilson and Thomas M.
