On this *thirtieth* day of *March* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-*five* personally appeared before the subscriber, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, *William Kent* a resident of *Crimstone* in the County of *Penobscot* and State aforesaid, aged *Seventy* years, who being duly sworn according to law, makes the following DECLARATION, in order to obtain the Bounty Land in virtue of the provisions of the Acts of Congress passed *March 3^d 1855*

That he is the identical *Mr. Kent* who was a private in the Company of *Charles* commanded by Captain *Warren Ward* in the *1st* Regiment of *Genl. Blake* in the War with Great Britain declared by the United States on the 18th day of June, 1812: That he was called out at *Crimstone* on or about the *first* day of *September* A. D. 181*4* for the term of *twelve* and continued in actual service in said War for the term of *an engagement* and was honorably discharged at *Hampden* on the *or about the fifteenth* day of *September* A. D. 181*4* That he did not receive any written or printed discharge, but was discharged verbally: That his said service will fully appear by the muster rolls of said Company. *He further declares that he was engaged in actual Battle with the Enemy at said Hampden on the third day of September as will appear by the Pay rolls of said Company and by the affidavits herewith annexed*

He makes this Declaration for the purpose of obtaining the Bounty Land to which he is entitled by virtue of the Acts of Congress passed *March 3^d 1855* never having received or been entitled to Bounty Land under any other Act of Congress, only as aforesaid, and never having made any other application therefor only as aforesaid, *I hereby appoint Messrs. Heall of Bangor me to present said claims to and receive from the Department of the Interior the Bounty Land which may be issued to me*

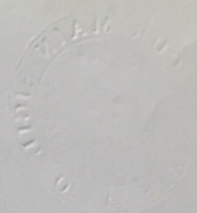
