On this 31st day of August A. D. Eighteen Hundred and Seventy-two personally appeared before me, John W. Leidigh Judge of the Probate Court, a Court of Record in and for the County and State aforesaid, Simon Kint, aged 85 years, a resident of Northwest Sp. County of Williams State of Ohio, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is married; that his wife's name was Ann Kint, to whom he was married at Northampton Co. Pa. on the 2nd day of October 1808, that he served the full period of sixty days in the Military Service of the United States in the War of 1812; that he is the identical Simon Kint who (2) was drafted in Captain Louis H. Galt's Company, Regiment, Brigade, Division, at Northampton Co. Pa., on the 15th day of June 18, and was honorably discharged at Malden on the 15th day of October, 18; that (3) served as a Private soldier and was engaged in action at Malden

that he, at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States adhered to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of any office whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; and that he will support the Constitution of the United States; that he is not in receipt of a pension under any previous act; that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension rolls of the United States, under the provisions of the act approved February 14, 1871, and he hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, WM. E. PRESTON, Licensed Military Claim Agent, of Cleveland, Ohio, his true and lawful attorney, to prosecute his claim, and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that his POST OFFICE ADDRESS IS at Northwest P. O. County of Williams State of Ohio; that his domicile or place of abode is Northwest Sp. Williams County Ohio

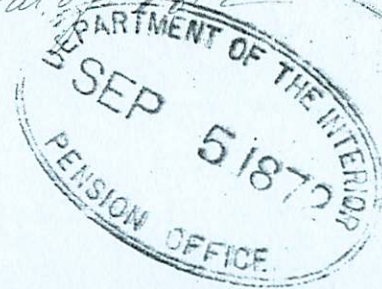

On this *28th* day of *May*, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and seventy *one*, personally appeared before me *John W. Bridgish Judge*, of the *Probate Court*, a court of record within and for the county and State aforesaid *Simon Kint*, aged *84* years a resident of *North West Township*, county of *Williams* State of *Ohio*, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is married;

that his wife's name was *Anna Koheneschitt*, to whom he was married at *Northampton Co. Penn* - on the *2nd* day of *October* *1808*,

that he served the full period of sixty days in the *military* service of the United States in the war of 1812; that he is the identical *Simon Kint* who,

was drafted in Captain *William Shurlock's* *8th* company, regiment, *Pa. Militia* brigade, division,

at *Northampton Co. Penn* or about *10th* day of *August* *1812*;

and was honorably discharged at *Fort Moulton*, on the day of *November*, 1812; that *served at Fort Moulton and*

was in the engagement at that place - Served under Capts William Shurlock and Hugh McFall and Col. Shall

that he, at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States, adhered to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort; or exercised the functions of any office whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; and that he will support the Constitution of the United States; that he is not in receipt of a pension under any previous act; that he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States, under the provision of the act approved February 14,

1871, and he hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revocation, *J. W. Tallmadge*
